High school basketball bound together communities across the state and interest in the sport rose to a new level. The period saw the MilanMuncie Central game, given new fame through the movie Hoosiers. It also saw the first televised game, the start of the career of Oscar Robertson (who played for Crispus Attucks), and friendly town rivalries to build the states biggest gymnasium. It was a time before the massive consolidations of the 1960s and 70s, with more than 700 teams involved in basketball tournaments. (There are some 300 now.) Greg Guffey captures the flavor of the period and showcases many of the best teams, players, and coaches. This is a book for all fans of Indiana basketball. This item ships from multiple locations.
